This briefing is to advise that on the 19th July 2011 we will be introducing a brand new NNI (Network Node Identifier) in addition to the ten which exist already. The new NNI will be 9640079 and will start with a File Generation Number of 0001.

This change only affects those Wholesale Calls customers that use the four hourly unrated "fraud" files.

Please note there will be no impact on the rated Daily Calls files.

Initially the volume of unrated events in the new NNI files will be very small as we start to migrate our exchanges to the new Mediation platform. However, as the new mediation rollout programme gathers momentum, the volume from the new NNI will increase. Eventually, this will become the single remaining NNI as one by one the existing NNI file outputs are phased out. We will advise you at a later date of the timescales involved.

To allow for these changes to take place, we will have to suspend the polling of the unrated call records for up to two hours across the various mediator nodes. This will delay less than 1% of all Wholesale Calls traffic for up to two hours every Tuesday and Thursday from 19th July to 15th September 2011.
